Day Guests (those not staying overnight) will be charged a \$2.00 per person, per day fee for pool use and must be accompanied by a registered, responsible host. Minor children under the age of 18 years must be supervised at all times by parent(s) or responsible adult.

Ground Cover: Only artificial turf-type material, designed for outdoors, may be used.

Pets: FOY is a pet-friendly resort. We supply several pet stops throughout the park, and count on pet owners to pick up after their pets. Please enjoy our dog park and community dog walk paths. Our buildings, pool areas and community center are pet-free zones.

Peace and Quiet Hours: Silence is Golden! Please avoid making unnecessary, loud noise at anytime. Very Quiet Hours are observed from 10:00 pm to 7:00 am. Generator hours

are 8:00 am to 9:00 pm - overflow area only.

Surge Protectors are recommended for all electrical appliances and devices.

Smoking: Thank you for not smoking in our community buildings, around the pool and within 20 feet of buildings.

Messages: Phone messages will be taken by office during working hours; emergency messages will be taken by gate staff until 10:00 pm or closing, and delivered as soon as possible. There is a charge to receive e-mail or fax messages.

Pools: Heated pools and spas are open from 6:00 am to 10:00 pm. It is California State Law that you shower before entering pools and spas. Remove all suntan oil, bandages, etc. Smoking and food are not allowed in pool areas. Drinks in plastic containers are permitted.

Propane: Portable bottles and motorhomes are filled Monday through Friday between 11 am to 12 noon; Please obtain ticket in advance from the office.

Water: In case of water outage, please keep RV holding tank full.

Trash Disposal: Please use trash containers located throughout park for removal of bagged garbage.

Dump Station is located in Dry Camp area.

Golf Carts, ATVs, Dirt Bikes: May be driven throughout the community by licensed drivers only. Desert toys - including ATVs, dirt bikes and sand rails - are to be operated quietly in FOY and driven directly to/from the nearest exit. Bicycles must be ridden on the street, with the flow of traffic. Please observe stop signs and other signs and keep to the right of the roadway. Bikes and vehicles operated after dark are required to have fully operational lights.

Car Wash: Vehicles can ONLY be washed in the car wash located in the Dry Camp area.

Speed Limit: Please obey all posted traffic signs.

Mail Room: In-season hours are Monday to Friday 8:30 am to 4:30 pm (closed 11 am to 2 pm for sorting. Hours may vary depending on mail delivery). Saturday's mail is sorted in boxes, window closed. Closed Sundays. In order to serve you best, only the mail room staff can assist you with your mail. If you have any questions, please call the mail room at 760-354-1557.
